

Year 3 & 4 - What are the many reasons people have celebrated & commemorated in the Perth town hall?

Some answers: To welcome dignitaries - *The explorers John Forrest & Ernest Giles* , *Royal visits, the many [celebrations](#) of the centenary of the Colony in 1929, [Lord Kitchener in 1910](#): Balls, Roller skating Ball in 1878, First Exhibition & Bazaar in aid of the Benevolent fund for the destitute in Sept 1870, Vincent Serventy Wildlife shows in the 1940s-70s, Coolbaroo League dance 1954, Instrumental and vocal Grand music concert in 1870, First wildflower exhibition in 1892, wildlife shows in 1950s, sporting events including [fencing](#) in 1951, badminton, roller-skating, gymnastic and calisthenics in 1913, [CWA](#) spinning and handicrafts shows in 1935, entertaining the Australian troops (from SA & NSW) with a ball and dinner on their way to the Boer war, V Day celebrations after WWII, a recreation centre for soldiers in WWII, [Welcome home dances](#) for soldiers in 1945, [Wireless \(radio\)](#) in 1931 & TV exhibitions, Monster meetings to debate political issues, eg Federation in the 1890s, see [Monster Public tea meeting in 1870s](#) to abstain from alcohol elections, citizenship ceremonies, First [telegram](#) service unveiled, Many shops such as Craven's pharmacy, [Rosebud tearooms](#), Maxim's cafe.*
